

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Wstęp

Książka **Articles B1. Przedimki B1** powstała z myślą o uczniach przygotowujących się zarówno do egzaminu maturalnego z języka angielskiego na poziomie podstawowym (B1/B1+), jak i innych egzaminów na tym poziomie językowym. Zamieszczono w niej 60 krótkich lekcji, w których omówiono nie tylko użycie przedimków określonych i nieokreślonych, lecz również zastosowanie wszelkiego typu określników, zaimków i określeń ilości.

Układ podręcznika **Articles B1. Przedimki B1** pozwala na pracę z nim na dwa sposoby. Materiał można przerabiać liniowo, dzięki czemu uczeń utrwala wiadomości i coraz sprawniej posługuje się przedimkami, określnikami, zaimkami i określeniami ilości. Po drugie, ponieważ lekcje nie są ze sobą ściśle powiązane, uczeń przygotowujący się do egzaminu może wybrać dowolne z nich i przerabiać je w ustalonej przez siebie kolejności.

Podręcznik **Articles B1. Przedimki B1** zawiera pełny klucz odpowiedzi, dlatego nadaje się zarówno do pracy w klasie, jak i do samodzielnej powtórki.

- Uwzględnia nie tylko przedimki określone i nieokreślone, lecz również blisko 60 określników (determiners), zaimków (pronouns) i określeń ilości (quantifiers)
- Zawiera 60 krótkich lekcji 45 lekcji prezentujących materiał językowy oraz 15 lekcji powtórkowych
- Przystępny układ lekcji z prostą prezentacją zasad i ćwiczeniami otwartymi
- Nacisk na naturalny język i codzienne sytuacje poprzez wykorzystanie 75 dialogów
- Klucz odpowiedzi do wszystkich ćwiczeń
